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OHSLA Fall 2014 Meeting Summary

The fall OHSLA meeting was held at Summa Barberton Hospital, Barberton, Ohio, on October 24, 2014.

Twenty-four members attended. The CE Class, *Planning, Conducting & Publishing Research*, was taught by **Nancy Allee**, Deputy Director, Taubman Health Sciences Library, University of Michigan. She gave a dynamic presentation that provided an introduction to the research process with an emphasis on health sciences library settings. Participants built their research skills by gaining an understanding of the processes involved in taking a project from initial idea creation to final publication.

The attendees rated the content a 4.37 (out of a 5 point scale), clarity of the presentation 4.58, experience of the presenter 4.75, value of handouts 4.29, and appropriate format for topic 4.33. The overall rating was 4.46. The attendees rated the food as 4.2, the meeting room 4.2, the location 4.1 and parking 4.0 (overall 4.13).

What comes to mind when you hear the word *leader*? There are many meanings and roles of a leader. The State Library of Ohio and OHIONET give librarians of all types a chance to explore and grow as leaders at the biannual Library **Leadership Ohio Institute (LLO)**. It is open to public, academic, special and school librarians at all levels and positions. In July of 2014, I had the privilege to participate in this program.

A major part of LLO is a working on a group project that will benefit libraries throughout the state. It is also a great time to start using those leadership skills. Each participant is assigned to a group prior to the start of LLO, and time is set aside for the groups to meet and develop their projects over the course of the three-day Institute.

"Engaging and Empowering Learning Experiences" is the theme of my group. During our project planning time, we brainstormed on ways to develop a meaningful program that would reach across library disciplines and provide examples of engaging and empowering learning experiences. Thus, **All for Un: Ohio's Interlibrary Unconference** was born.

What is an Unconference? Our group defines it as a participant-guided learning opportunity that encourages peer networking and audience participation. *All for Un* will serve as an opportunity to peer teach among library colleagues, providing a fo-

rum for librarians to collaborate on creating engaging and empowering learning experiences for their users.

All for Un is free and takes place from 1:30-4:00 p.m., Wednesday, April 15 at the State Library of Ohio, 274 East 1st Avenue, Columbus. To learn more about the event and register, visit:

My day-to-day supervision of students and volunteers as well as the group project work have benefited from participating in LLO. The program allows for self-discovery, helping you identify your core strengths, and gives you ways to utilize them on a daily basis.
