Spring Meeting Recap- Debi Orr, OHSLA President

The spring meeting was held at OhioHealth Doctors Hospital, Columbus, Ohio, on April 24, 2015. Nineteen members were in attendance. The CE Class, Super Searcher: Enhancing your online search super powers, was taught by Tony Nguyen, Emerging Technologies/Communications Coordinator at the NN/LM Southeastern-Atlantic Region. He gave a dynamic presentation that provided information on search techniques and the use of other search engines that may be of interest to librarians. Attendees worked through online exercises using their own laptops or other devices.

Charlotte Sievert, President, thanked the outgoing Executive Committee for their service and presented certificates. Debi Orr, President-elect presented Charlotte with a gift as a token of her work and dedication to the organization.

The attendees rated the content a 4.4 (out of a 5 point scale), clarity of the presentation 4.4, experience of the presenter 4.4, value of handouts 4.5, and appropriate format for topic 4.5. The attendees rated the food as 4.2, the meeting room 4.4, the location 4.4 and parking 4.5. Comments from the attendees were very positive: "This topic was more interesting/useful than I had expected", "Awesome meeting", "Very well run Spring Meeting and I liked the format. Excellent content."

Seventy-three percent of those attending received full financial support from their employer for attendance at the meeting, 10% received partial support. With the meeting being in Central Ohio, 42% of the attendees were from that area, with Northeast Ohio 36%, Southwest 10%, and Northwest and Southeast Ohio 05% respectively. As for employment demographics, hospital attendance was 57%, academics 42%, and other was 05%.

She is a working hospital librarian at the Cleveland Clinic, manning the reference desk, doing literature searches, conducting education classes, supervising the library paraprofessional staff, and resolving various library technology issues.

Since taking over as president, Michelle has represented MLA in Canada, South Africa, and several U. S. locations. In the June, 2015 MLA blog *Full Speed Ahead* (<http://fullspeedahead.mlanet.org/?p=142>), Michelle outlines her leadership thoughts this way. "Change is everywhere, and there is no way to stop it. MLA, librarians, and libraries are all experiencing change. Since we can't stop change, the best thing we can do is plan for it."
